

RAIDERS OF MOSLEY H.Q. FINED

£300 DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

Five members of the anti-Fascist Yellow Star Movement who were alleged to have raided Sir Oswald Mosley's Union Movement headquarters in Vauxhall Bridge Road, S.W., where they did damage to the value of £300 to property and assaulted two officials, were fined at the Central Criminal Court yesterday. A sixth member, aged 16, was bound over for two years.

Michael Nathan Dryer, aged 29, mechanic, of Chase Gardens, Chingford, was fined £35; Phillip Fox, aged 21, of Denver Road, Hackney, £30; David Freedman, aged 19, of Solandes Gardens, Stepney, E., £25; Paul Joseph Salkin, aged 19, invoice clerk, of Darling Row, Whitechapel, E., £20; and Barry Allan Saltman, aged 18, apprentice production supervisor, of Newick Road, Hackney, £10.

In default of payment there will be a sentence of three months' imprisonment. Anthony Angell, aged 16, of Samuel Trust Buildings, Dalston Lane, Hackney, was bound over for two years.

All withdrew their pleas of Not Guilty and pleaded Guilty to charges of maliciously causing damage to property at the Union Movement's headquarters. They further admitted assaulting Keith Gibson, the movement's political secretary, and Robert Row, editor of *Action*.
