# EDITOR "MADE TO KNEEL"

The editor of *Action*—the organ of Sir Oswald Mosley's Union Movement—was made to kneel on the floor and tear up copies of the publication when members of an anti-fascist organization raided the movement's Vauxhall Bridge headquarters, Tower Bridge Magistrates were told yesterday.

Six members of the Yellow Star Movement were accused of attacking two officials and causing damage valued at about £300 to office equipment. The hearing was adjourned until June 24, all six accused being allowed bail. Mr. John Hazan, for the prosecution, had asked for committal to the Central Criminal Court.

Joel Salkin, aged 19, invoice clerk, of Grindall House, Darling Row, E.; Phillip Fox, aged 21, unemployed, of Denver Road, N.; Anthony Angel, aged 16, hairdressers' apprentice, of Samuel Lewis Trust Buildings, Dalston Lane, E.; Michael Nathan Dryer, aged 29, mechanic, of Chase Gardens, Chingford, E.; and Barry Alan Saltman, aged 18, apprentice production surveyor, of Newick Road, E., were charged with being concerned together in an attack causing actual bodily harm to Mr. Keith Gibson, the Union Movement's political secretary, and to Mr. Robert Row, editor of *Action*.

David Freedman, aged 19, unemployed, of Solandes Gardens, Stepney, E., was charged with assault, occasioning actual bodily harm, to Mr. Gibson only.

## "CHAOS BROKE OUT"

All six were also charged that, with other persons unknown and on the same occasion, they riotously assembled together and assaulted Robert Row.

Mr. Hazan said that with others unknown the six gained entry to the movement's headquarters by wearing Union Movement badges at 1.15 p.m. on May 12. Inside, chaos broke out. Mr. Row and Mr. Gibson were seized, beaten up, and kicked. At one stage Mr. Row was trussed up hand and foot and made to lie on the floor. Flare guns and a fire extinguisher were let off during the raid.

It was because of the timely intervention of the police, perhaps, that any repercussion or retaliation was avoided. Mr. Hazan said. Mr. Row was treated at hospital for abrasions and cuts about the face and injuries to the legs and ankles. His lip and cheek were torn. Mr. Gibson had scalp lacerations. He also had other marks all over his face.
